#### **Narrative Report**

I am a licensed clinical psychologist specialized in the mental health care of patients with major medical illness or disease. After completing my specialization in Health Psychology at William James College, I pursued APA accredited pre-doctoral training at Charles River Community Health Center. I completed my post-doctoral training in integrated primary care at four family and internal medicine offices of the Milford Regional Physician Group. I joined the faculty of Kerzner Associates, PC as a staff psychologist and continued working as the integrated psychologist for the Milford Regional Physician Group offices. After a year working with the Milford Regional Physician Group, I joined the faculty at Massachusetts General Hospital (MGH). At MGH I provide clinical care, administrative support, referral and resource development, and delivery of research protocols in the Center for Psychiatric Oncology and Behavioral Sciences.

My clinical interests and expertise revolve around the practice of integrated psychological practices in medical specialties. Between 2010-2013, my medical specialty interest included adults with congenital heart diseases (ACHD). Since 2013 and throughout my training, my interests evolved to include other major medical illnesses with associated psychiatric conditions: fertility/pregnancy, sexual health, gastrointestinal disorders, rheumatological disorders, and oncology. In each of the locations I served, i.e. community, internal, and family practices, I contributed to improvement of communication between departments, referral development and education, and self-care programs for providers.

I have been actively involved in the education of clinical and non-clinical care providers about integrated psychological services. Through community-based programming as well as seminars delivered to colleagues, I hope to increase mental health visibility, decrease psychiatric stigma across cultures, and improve the referral process within an integrated healthcare setting. I am currently co-leading a collaborative

care initiative to improve referrals, delivery of care, and communication strategies with oncology mental health providers in the MGH Cancer Center.

I am working to further develop my clinical care, teaching ability, and connection to future healthcare providers. Through my community-based work, my writing, review, and delivery of research, my involvement in professional societies, and my execution of program development, I seek to improve the health and healthcare experience of patients with psychiatric disorders secondary to major medical illness or disease.
