Additionally, we developed specialty trainings for specific diagnoses and challenges in pediatric psychiatry. We oversaw and coordinated a network of child psychiatrists and administrative staff across the state who implemented under our design doctor to doctor consultations as well as direct face to face evaluations of children. Utilizing extensive data collection and analysis, combined with outreach to state and national organizations we improved reach and efficacy of the program and I have presented on this work in the program at national and international meetings.

Narrative Report:

Introduction.

I am a board certified general and pediatric psychiatrist. After completing an internship in internal medicine and residency in general psychiatry, I completed my fellowship in child and adolescent psychiatry at MGH and McLean Hospital. I then joined the faculty of New York-Presbyterian/Weill Cornell Medical Center where I served as Director of Inpatient Services, Director of the Day Hospital, Site Training Director and ultimately as Service Chief, before returning to MGH, McLean and HMS to assume the directorship of the fellowship that trained me. I also serve as the Executive Director of the MGH Psychiatry Academy (MGHPA).

Area of Excellence: Teaching and Educational Leadership.

My primary expertise is in training and education across the medical student to professional continuum. For over 15 years, I have employed innovative teaching methods, technology, institutional level consultation, and original curricula while conducting and contributing to funded education research. I have developed comprehensive general and specialized educational and clinical expertise in the areas of hospital

administrative consultation, the psychopharmacology and family therapy of severe pediatric depression, and basic research in pediatric social withdrawal.

In addition to directing two of the nation's largest and best regarded child and adolescent psychiatry fellowships, I have created unique and successful programs within the MGHPA to address critical gaps in the education of mental health and primary care professionals, including *MGH Visiting*. This program, unprecedented in any other academic institution to date, allows practitioners at outside institutions to practice side-by-side with MGH professionals while benefitting from additional management consultation, interim leadership and Continuing Medical Education credit. I have developed expansions of the MGHPA's conference, publishing, direct care and consulting portfolios to now include Europe, Asia and the Middle East.

I have been the primary or co-investigator for multiple, diverse education grants including foci such as the education of primary care physicians and general psychiatrists in the practice of basic pediatric psychiatry, the use of the fine arts in effecting health promoting behaviors in combat veterans, spinal cord injury care, burn injury care, traumatic brain injury and mood disorders. In 2016, the State of New York Office of Mental Health released a national request for proposals to re-design and lead their statewide program which integrates pediatric psychiatry expertise into the practices of primary care and general psychiatry statewide. My proposal resulted in the Massachusetts General Hospital being awarded this role for a period of 5.5 years, during which I and a team of MGH experts were invited to re-design and lead the system in addition to being invited to give lectures in pediatric psychiatry throughout the state. This was the only time such a role was ever granted to an institution and individuals outside the state of New York.

Administrative & Institutional Service.

As Director of the MGH Psychiatry Division of Postgraduate Education, I oversee a large operational infrastructure and am responsible for the Department's CME enterprise and an extended portfolio of intrapreneurship efforts. I have grown our membership to over 80,000 members in 127 countries and have more than doubled the number of recurring live programs. I oversee a dozen support staff, approximately 30 regular professional staff and additional contributions of over 600 faculty in multiple departments. I developed and implemented a strategic vision for the MGHPA that now includes CME, publishing, temporary on-site coverage, telepsychiatry, management consulting, interim leadership and education and dissemination grant writing and execution. I also provide design and regulatory oversight for the CME elements of Child Psychiatry's national organization.

Investigation

I have conducted original basic research and scholarship on the genotypic and phenotypic characterization of social withdrawal in children and adolescents. I published the first latent class analysis of withdrawn behavior in a pediatric population and have also shown that two single nucleotide polymorphisms of the ADRA2a and 5HTR2A receptors account for a developmentally sensitive variation of withdrawn behaviors in the pediatric population. I have published on anhedonia in adolescent depression and when withdrawn children later manifest extreme violence. At the bench level, contributed to understanding of the role of transcription factor MIP-2 in the inflammation pathway.

I have written extensively on the treatment of pediatric depression, including one of the earliest reviews of the FDA Black Box warnings on antidepressants in children. I have contributed to the characterization of auditory hallucinations as a migraine aura in psychiatrically healthy children.

Education of Patients and Service to the Community.

I have been a regular contributor to mainstream media on a host of topics. I give frequent community lectures and have also developed numerous successful patient outreach.

Summary.

Since my appointment as Lecturer at HMS I have endeavored to provide excellent administrative oversight and teaching, while conducting funded basic and educational research.
